## **Entry Requirements**

AVIR Institute of Skills has the following entry requirements for International Students:

#### **International students must:**

- > Be at least 18 years of age.
- Have completed Year 12 or equivalent.
- > Participate in a course entry interview to determine suitability for the course and student needs.
- > Must hold a current and valid study Visa
- > Must undertake an ACSF level 3 LLN (language, literace and numeracy) assessment
- Have an IELTS\* score of 5.5 (test results must be no more than 2 years old).
  English language competence can also be demonstrated through documented evidence of any of the following:
  - Educated for 5 years in an English-speaking country; or
  - · Successful completion of an English Placement Test

\*Note that other English language tests such as PTE and TOEFL can be accepted. Students are required to provide their results so that it can be confirmed they are equivalent to IELTS 5.5.

## **Conditions of Entry:**

For international students: it is a condition of entry that upon acceptance, students provide evidence of having an Australian Student Visa (subclass 500). ## **Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)**

Student undertaking CPC courses at Avir Institute must ensure that they have Personal Protective Equipment and material kit including safety shoes (Steel toe), Protective glasses, safety vest (Neon/Glowing), Protective gloves, earmuffs and working uniform mask and hard hat required for practical sessions. This kit is required to enter into the Painting and Construction workshop located on campus to be able to undertake training effectively.

Students are required to discuss their capabilities in the above areas and any concerns they have during the entry interview.

# **Delivery Arrangements**

Students are required to attend scheduled classes of 20 hours every week which include face-to-face classroom delivery, practical sessions in the simulated workshop and assessments. Students will also be expected to spend at least 8 hours every week undertaking structured independent learning such as required reading, research, assignment work, homework tasks, preparation for presentations, webinars, unsupervised excursions, industry visits, and meetings with trainers.

AVIR requires all students to undertake an ACSF Level 3 assessment and pre-training review upon enrolment to determine the suitability of the course and identify any additional support needs that you may have.
